

As Deputy Attorney General, Maggy Krell developed a breakthrough legal theory that dismantled the largest on-line sex trafficking operation in the nation. # Will, or Should Former Vice President Kamala Harris Run for Governor of California in 2026?

According to sources close to her, former Vice President Kamala Harris is seriously considering running for Governor of California in 2026. She has indicated that she will make a decision by the end of this summer. "I am staying in this fight," she repeated to allies in phone calls and at private gatherings. "Her name recognition, her favorables, her ability to run a successful campaign would have the impact of clearing the field on the Democratic side," State Attorney General Rob Bonta said in an interview with Politico.

Currently, there are several democratic and less than a handful of republican candidates who have filed to run for Governor. However, according to early polls, Harris' run for Governor would be hurdle-free, as she would be ahead of the game with her name recognition, and a coveted mailing list.

Harris would need to consider the difficult challenges with which California is currently faced such as the budget deficit, climate change, high gas prices, utility rates, housing and homelessness, and natural disasters. Republican opponents would likely run on a campaign making the notion that nothing would change, as her policies and positions are similar to that of Governor Newsom's. According to the Sacramento Bee, she would need to offer a platform with a real plan specifically addressing each issue.

During the Presidential campaign against Donald Trump, former V.P. Harris proved that she could remain calm and seemingly unruffled by his personal and offensive remarks. Her ability to ignore the bait and remain civil and respectful in these situations, can aid in ensuring that Californians are kept safe from potential threats from the Trump administration.

Furthermore, it would be remarkable, if former Vice President Harris were elected as governor, as in addition to making an inroad of being the first woman of color to serve as Vice President of the United States, she would once again go down in history as the first Black female governor in our United States of America.

My bet is that she will be California's next Governor.



**First**, on the National Level, Congress has introduced a bill called the S.A.V.E. Act. This bill will heavily impact female voters' ability to register to vote due to the language of the bill and the restrictions on what is required as proof of citizenship.

### Message from Brennan Center for Justice:

Do you know where your birth certificate is? Millions of Americans don't. Yet House Republicans are fast-tracking a sweeping voter restriction bill called the SAVE Act, which would require every American to provide a document like a passport or birth certificate to register or re-register to vote.

The consequences of this draconian bill? Twentyone million American citizens could be blocked from registering to vote, simply because they don't have ready access to the required documents.

Champions of democracy stood strong last year, and the SAVE Act failed to become law. But a new landscape in Washington means that members of Congress may not stand up to protect your freedom to vote. We can't let the SAVE Act slip through the cracks.

**Second,** Assemblymember DeMaio submitted Assembly Bill (AB) 25, the California Voter ID and Election Integrity Act of 2025, which also seeks to disrupt citizens' ability to register to vote. This bill is currently pending discussion in the Elections Committee. Our goal is to make sure this bill fails in the Committee and it is not brought to the floor.

## Speakers Series 2025

### What is the Women Democrats Speakers Series?

Remarkable leaders and agents of change within the community participate in the Women Democrats Speakers Series to discuss thought-provoking topics, meet members and answer questions. The Coordinator of our Speakers Series is **Debbie Richardson**, Women Democrats Vice President.

The Speakers Series for February had attendees on the edge of their seats with guest speakers Lee Miller and Rosanna Herber, SMUD Board President. Lee Miller, a veteran community advocate, currently serves on the Sacramento County Office of Education's Personnel Commission and she was a former commissioner on the Vineyard Community Planning Advisory Council (CPAC) and the Sacramento Adult & Aging CPAC. Lee spoke regarding the process and procedures of voting for representatives who are elected by Assembly District Election Meetings (ADEMS) to represent their fellow Democrats on the California Democratic Party State Central Committee. These representatives are referred to as Assembly District delegates or as ADEM delegates.

Board President, <u>Director Rosanna Herber</u>, Ward 4, of the Sacramento Municipality Utilities District (SMUD), shared information and insight regarding SMUD's programs and initiatives. Rosanna Herber was first elected to the SMUD Board of Directors in 2018 and represents Ward 4, which includes Curtis Park, Land Park, Greenhaven, Pocket, Walnut Grove and parts of Elk Grove. Rosanna was part of the Climate Change Ad Hoc Committee that wrote the Climate Emergency Declaration. Rosanna has dedicated 20 years of her career working at SMUD in varying capacities.

The Speakers Series for March was just as exceptional! We honored Women's History Month by inviting featured quest panelist Diana Madoshi who is on the Advisory Committee of the National Women's History Alliance (NWHA). NWHA's mission is to promote women's history and they are committed to the goals of education, empowerment, equality, and inclusion. Diana has dedicated her time to organizing events focused on women's issues. A founding member of the California Women Suffrage Centennial Committee, she helped promote statewide celebrations of women winning the vote. Known as a "go-to person" for getting things done, Diana continues to organize Women's History Month programs and provide service on nonprofit boards, including the League of Women Voters. She is a mother and grandmother and inspires her family and community to "plant seed" for future generations.



The Speaker Series for April will feature attorney Giselle Garcia, an Organizer with NorCal Resist who will speak regarding immigration issues within the County of Sacramento, the impact the Trump administration and the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement has made upon our immigrants, and she will provide information regarding the awesome work that NorCal Resist is doing. Giselle is a first-generation Latina college and law school graduate striving to transform systems of power yielding oppressive influence over the lives of the marginalized. She is a community organizer and advocate for undocumented and incarcerated neighbors focused on the goal of achieving true autonomy for the disenfranchised.
